Program Impact: The unfunded portion represents support staff positions that will be left vacant to cover the shortfall in general funds represented by the proposed general fund allocation. These vacancies will have the following impact.

The additional reduction in general fund will result in fewer support services for our attorneys in our Juvenile Dependency Unit.

The attorneys rely on support for their updated court documentation in our case management system as well as up-to-date files provided to them for hearings.
